Im Prinzip liegt es bei Ansätzen dieser Art nahe, Jugend nur in der Differenz zum Erwachsenen zu sehen und die Aufgabe dahin zu definieren, diese Differenz möglichst schnell abzubauen. So ist es nicht verwunderlich, dass ein konkurrierendes Paradigma entworfen worden ist, das die Jugend als Moratorium bzw. später als Bildungsmoratorium konzeptualisiert hat. Auf Zeit wurde der Jugend in dieser Sicht Eigenständigkeit zugebilligt. Im Widerspruch zu solchen inhaltlich oder zeitlich einschränkenden Sichtweisen von Jugend steht das Ansehen von Jugendlichkeit in der heutigen Gesellschaft. Bestimmte Aspekte sind stilbildend, das gilt beispielsweise für Mode und Unterhaltungsmusik. Biologisch wird ebenfalls das Vorbild in der Jugend gesehen, deren körperliche Elastizität und Spannkraft man bis ins hohe Alter bewahren will. Kreativität wird zusätzlich eher mit Jugend als mit älteren Jahrgängen verbunden.

Sborník *Amici Amico III* je věnován životnímu jubileu prof. Ludvíka E. Václavka, obsahuje celkem 51 příspěvků od 52 autorů (jeden z článků pochází od dvou autorů) a dělí se na dvě části. Vedle předmluvy Ingeborg Fialové obsahuje první část příspěvky neformálního charakteru. Místo je zde věnováno vzpomínkám, nechybí ani esejistické či beletristické texty. Druhá, podstatně rozsáhlejší část čítající 37 příspěvků, se již vyznačuje přísně vědeckým stylem. Ačkoliv převažují literární témata (jak z oblasti novověku, resp. moderny, tak z oblasti středověku), je škála velmi různorodá, zastoupeny jsou i příspěvky z oblasti jazykovědy, pedagogiky nebo architektury.
