- 5. **RESPECT COPYRIGHTS:** MANY PHOTOGRAPHS ARE OWNED OR LICENSED BY THE TITANIC HISTORICAL SOCIETY; ALWAYS SEEK PERMISSION BEFORE PUBLISHING OR SHARING.

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF TITANIC HISTORICAL SOCIETY PHOTOS

- ACCESSIBILITY: THROUGH NEWSLETTERS, CONFERENCES, AND ONLINE PLATFORMS, THE TITANIC HISTORICAL SOCIETY ACTIVELY DISSEMINATES PHOTOS TO A GLOBAL AUDIENCE, FOSTERING CONTINUOUS INTEREST AND RESEARCH.

IN CONTRAST, NATIONAL ARCHIVES MAY HOLD OFFICIAL RECORDS AND PHOTOGRAPHS BUT OFTEN LACK THE EXTENSIVE PERSONAL AND LESS-FORMAL IMAGERY THAT THE SOCIETY CURATES.

THE ROLE OF DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY IN EXPANDING ACCESS

The digitization of Titanic historical society photos has revolutionized how these images are studied and appreciated. High-resolution scanning, 3D modeling based on photographic evidence, and virtual exhibitions have made it possible for researchers and the public to engage with the Titanic story remotely.

DIGITAL ARCHIVES ALSO FACILITATE COMPARATIVE ANALYSES, SUCH AS:

- Mapping Changes in Ship design over time.
- CROSS-REFERENCING PASSENGER PHOTOGRAPHS WITH CENSUS DATA.
- RECONSTRUCTING THE SEQUENCE OF EVENTS THROUGH TIME-STAMPED IMAGES.

Thanks to the gift of a ticket from his uncle, a young Jesuit named Francis Browne travelled on the Titanic during her maiden voyage from Southampton, to Cherbourg to Cork. Invited to remain with the ship as it crossed the Atlantic, Fr Browne was saved from possible disaster by a telegram from his Jesuit superior ordering him to get off that ship. When the unthinkable happened and the Titanic sank, Fr Browne's photographs appeared on the front pages of newspapers all around the world. For many years the photographs of Fr Browne were forgotten until 1985 when Fr Eddie O'Donnell happened across an old tin trunk in the Jesuit archives and re-discovered 42,000 photographs, including the Titanic collection.
