DEALERS CULTIVATE RELATIONSHIPS WITH COLLECTORS TO CREATE DEMAND, WHILE ARTISTS' REPUTATIONS ARE CAREFULLY MANAGED THROUGH EXHIBITIONS AND MEDIA COVERAGE.

SOCIAL STRATIFICATION AND GATEKEEPING

THORNTON HIGHLIGHTS THE EXCLUSIVITY INHERENT IN THE ART WORLD, WHERE ACCESS AND INFLUENCE ARE TIGHTLY CONTROLLED BY A RELATIVELY SMALL GROUP OF INSIDERS. THIS GATEKEEPING AFFECTS WHO GAINS VISIBILITY AND FINANCIAL SUCCESS. THE BOOK'S ETHNOGRAPHIC DETAIL EXPOSES THE RITUALS AND CODES THAT REINFORCE SOCIAL HIERARCHIES—SUCH AS INVITATION-ONLY EVENTS, PRIVATE VIEWS, AND THE CULTIVATION OF PRESTIGE THROUGH ASSOCIATION WITH PRESTIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS.

THE ROLE OF INSTITUTIONS AND MEDIA

THE INTERPLAY BETWEEN INSTITUTIONS LIKE MUSEUMS, GALLERIES, AND MAGAZINES IS ANOTHER FOCAL POINT. ARTFORUM'S EDITORIAL CHOICES, FOR EXAMPLE, SHAPE TRENDS AND CRITICAL DISCOURSE, INFLUENCING WHICH ARTISTS ARE DEEMED SIGNIFICANT. BIENNIALS AND FAIRS SERVE AS PLATFORMS FOR EXPOSURE BUT ALSO AS ARENAS OF COMPETITION AND POLITICAL CONTESTATION. THORNTON'S OBSERVATIONS UNDERSCORE THE POWER DYNAMICS AT PLAY IN THESE INSTITUTIONAL SPACES.

ARTIST EXPERIENCE AND CREATIVE LABOR

CONTRARY TO ROMANTICIZED PORTRAYALS OF ARTISTS, *SEVEN DAYS IN THE ART WORLD* SARAH THORNTON OFFERS A CANDID LOOK AT THE PRECARIOUSNESS AND COMMERCIALIZATION OF ARTISTIC LABOR.
