Nach einem Überblick über Prinzipien der Diagnostik und Behandlung sowie über spezifische Verhaltensmerkmale bei genetischen Syndromen werden Interventionen bei u.a. Aufmerksamkeitsdefizit-/Hyperaktivitätsstörung, ängstlichen und depressiven sowie autistischen Verhaltensauffälligkeiten, Stereotypien und selbstverletzendem Verhalten dargestellt, und die Forschungslage zur Beurteilung ihrer Wirksamkeit wird bewertet. Der Band schließt mit einem Überblick zur Belastung der Eltern und Geschwister ab und zeigt Möglichkeiten der psychologischen Unterstützung auf. Damit gibt das Buch Fachkräften, die mit Kindern und Jugendlichen mit intellektueller Behinderung und deren Familien arbeiten, differenziertes Wissen für ihre Praxis an die Hand.

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
