That's acknowledged in the "use-it-or-lose-it" aphorism that states the obvious, that we remember what we use and forget what we don't. You know that to be true if you've ever forgotten things you once knew as well as your own name — things like an old address or a license plate number. Every child can understand base ten numeration when taught hands-on with arithmetic blocks. Thereby, every child can understand base ten arithmetic. And every child can learn how to count out the number facts, like $5 + 7 = 12$, $17 - 8 = 9$, $6 \times 7 = 42$, and $56 \div 7 = 8$, and, if they forget one, never have to guess and risk ridicule and bad grades if they guess wrong. What matters in teaching arithmetic is not how much a child can remember but how much they can figure out if/when they forget.
