You create emotional dependencies, manufacture desires that benefit you, and engineer beliefs that serve your agenda. You become what you once fought against, with infinitely more skill. I won't quote anyone from this path. They wouldn't want the attribution. The choice might seem obvious from the comfort of this moment, but power has a way of shifting moral landscapes. The first time someone you admire uses these techniques against you, lose something precious to a more skilled manipulator, or realize you could have anything you want if you just pushed the right buttons.... that's when you'll really choose your path.
