A KEY MOMENT WAS THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE IN 1776, WRITTEN BY THOMAS JEFFERSON. THIS DOCUMENT ANNOUNCED THAT THE COLONIES CONSIDERED THEMSELVES FREE AND INDEPENDENT STATES. THE WAR CONTINUED UNTIL 1783, ENDING WITH THE TREATY OF PARIS, WHICH RECOGNIZED THE UNITED STATES AS A NEW NATION.

AFTER WINNING INDEPENDENCE, THE NEW COUNTRY FACED MANY CHALLENGES. HOW WOULD IT BE GOVERNED? HOW COULD IT PROTECT THE RIGHTS OF ITS CITIZENS? THESE QUESTIONS LED TO THE CREATION OF THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION.

THE CONSTITUTION AND THE BILL OF RIGHTS

THE CONSTITUTION, WRITTEN IN 1787, ESTABLISHED THE FRAMEWORK FOR THE US GOVERNMENT. IT CREATED THREE BRANCHES: LEGISLATIVE, EXECUTIVE, AND JUDICIAL, TO MAKE SURE NO ONE HAD TOO MUCH POWER. THE BILL OF RIGHTS, ADDED LATER, GUARANTEED IMPORTANT FREEDOMS LIKE SPEECH, RELIGION, AND THE RIGHT TO A FAIR TRIAL.

EXPANSION AND GROWTH

As the young nation grew, settlers moved westward, exploring lands beyond the original colonies. This period is often called "Westward Expansion." The Louisiana Purchase in 1803 doubled the size of the country, and pioneers traveled on trails like the Oregon Trail to find new opportunities.
