THE RISE OF OCALA: FROM FRONTIER SETTLEMENT TO COUNTY SEAT

BY THE EARLY 19TH CENTURY, OCALA BEGAN TO ATTRACT AMERICAN SETTLERS MOVING INTO FLORIDA AFTER IT BECAME A U.S. TERRITORY IN 1821. THE CITY'S STRATEGIC LOCATION NEAR THE SILVER SPRINGS AND ALONG KEY TRANSPORTATION ROUTES MADE IT AN IDEAL SPOT FOR GROWTH.

ESTABLISHMENT OF MARION COUNTY AND OCALA'S FOUNDING

During this period, Ocala developed a reputation as a hub for agriculture, particularly citrus groves and cattle ranching. The arrival of the Florida Railroad in the late 1800s further accelerated growth by connecting Ocala to larger markets and encouraging trade.

THE GREAT FIRE OF 1883 AND RECONSTRUCTION

EUROPEAN CONTACT AND EARLY SETTLEMENT

THE ARRIVAL OF SPANISH EXPLORERS IN THE EARLY 1500s MARKED A TURNING POINT IN OCALA'S HISTORY.
