Arthur Conan Doyle, Agatha Christie, Dashiell Hammett, Raymond Chandler, Dorothy Sayers, Raoul
Whitfield, George Harmon Coxe, and Mickey Spillane, Yan demonstrates that the detective's
truth-generating function, most often characterized as a process of discovery rather than creation, is
in fact crucial to the institutional and class-based interests that he or she serves.
